

British Army Succession of Titles: Medical



The Royal Army Medical Service was formed on 15th November 2024 when the three human healthcare corps - medicine, nursing and dentistry - were amalgamated. Of the three antecedent Corps, only the RAMC had units with which a succession of titles may be tracked. The Royal Army Veterinary Corps (RAVC) remains an independent corps outside of the Royal Army Medical Service.

Royal Army Medical Corps (RAMC)

Following the Boer War, Clearing Hospitals were established from 1907 and these were retitled 'Casualty Clearing Stations' in 1915 then 'Field Hospitals' in 1970. During the First World War, Casualty Clearing Stations consisted of a commanding officer, quartermaster, six medical officers and 77 non-commissioned officers and other ranks. During the First World War, typically a 'Field Ambulance' consisted of 10 officers and 224 men. The headcount was similar in the Second World War. This resource only includes CCS/Field Hospitals and Field Ambulances that evolved into regiments.

Royal Army Dental Corps (RADC)

The Army Dental Service was established as a separate Corps in 1921 due to the high quantity of men during World War One unfit for service due to poor dental health. Prior to that date, dental officers commissioned into the RAMC. Dental officers are deployed to medical establishments and provide care to the British Army and local populations where required.

Queen Alexandra's Royal Army Nursing Corps (QARANC)

Although military nursing dates back to the civil wars of the 1640s, British Army nursing was not formalised until the creation of the Army Nursing Service in 1881. Nurses are assigned to medical establishments in the UK and abroad including hospitals and hospital ships.
